- To improve the skills of experienced teachers.

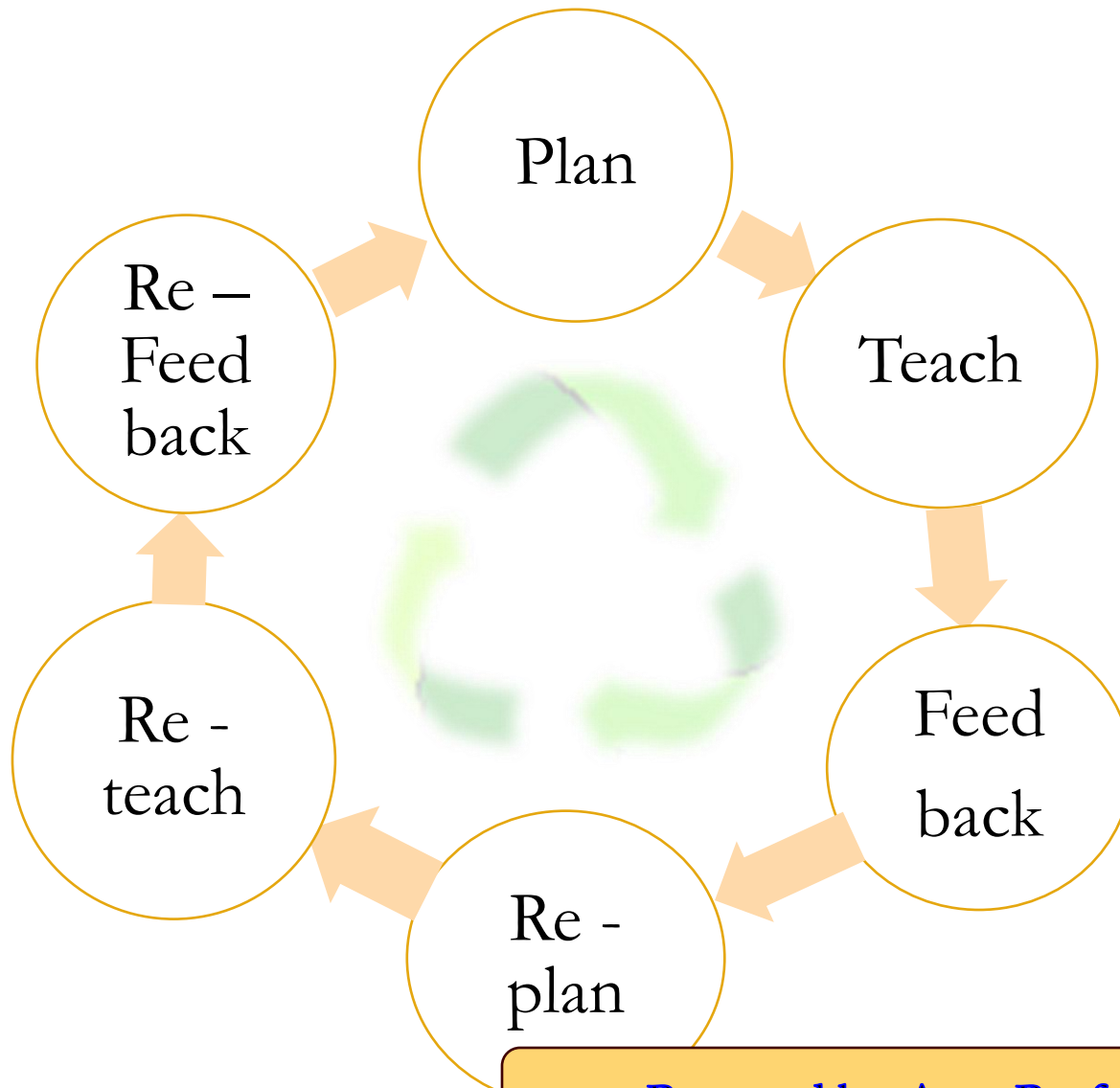

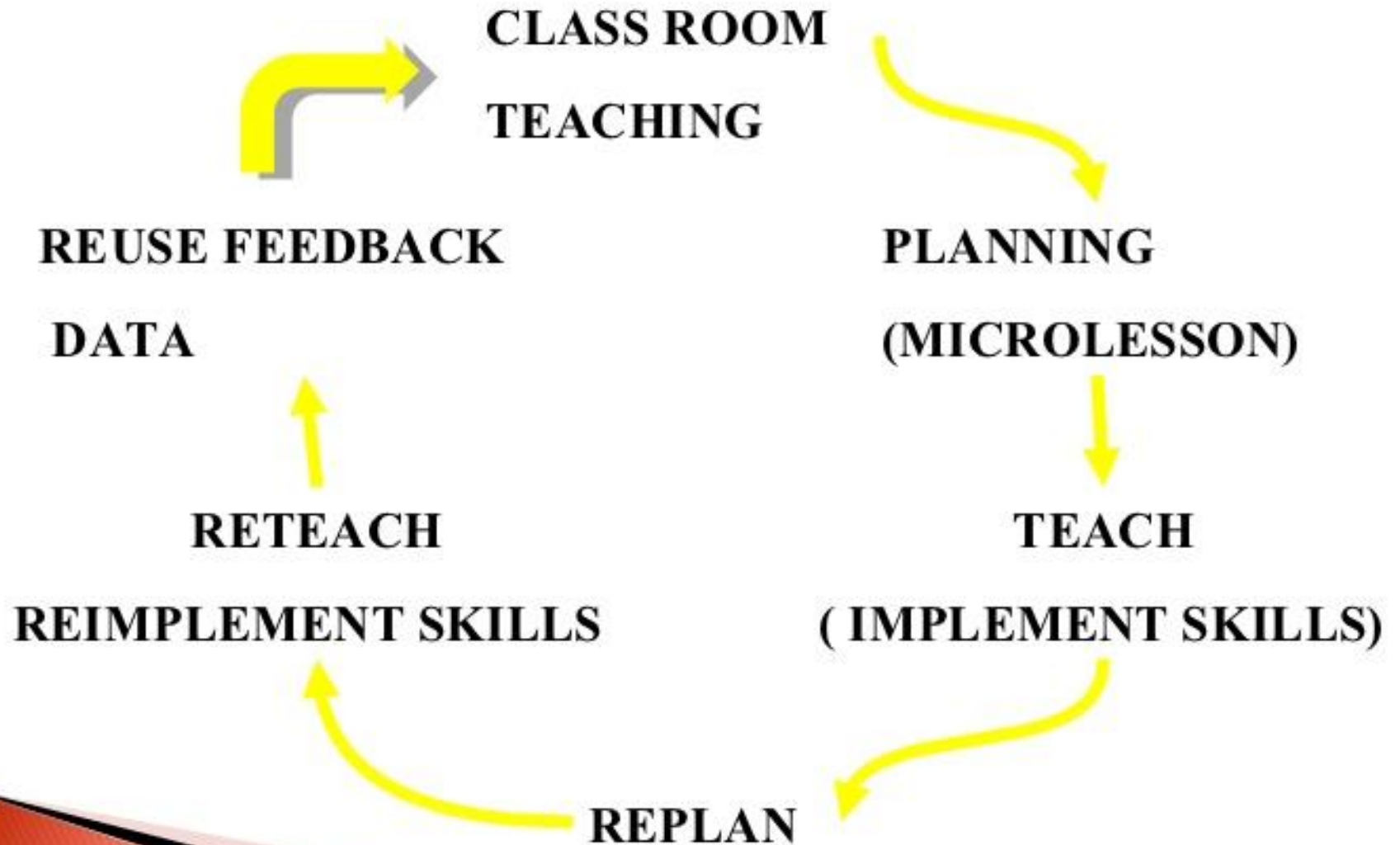
